

WHAT TO BRING...

You will need the following items to complete your 2024-25 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). If you are considered a dependent student for financial aid purposes, you will also need these items for your parent(s).

- 2022 federal tax return and W2s
- 2022 untaxed income records, such as child support or veterans noneducation benefits
- Information on savings, investments, business assets, and farm assets (if applicable)
- Social Security Number/Alien Registration Card/Permanent Resident Card
- Legal name, date of birth, Social Security Number, and email for parent(s)
- Month and year of parents' marriage, divorce, or separation
- Your FSA ID. The FSA ID is required for all students and contributors (parent or spouse) to complete the FAFSA. Visit studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch to create your FSA ID.**

Your FSA ID needs to be verified prior to completing the FAFSA, this typically takes three to five business days. The FSA ID is your signature, so it has to be unique to you and will be your FSA ID for life. Each FSA ID user must have a unique mobile phone number and/or email address.

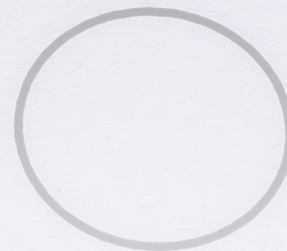
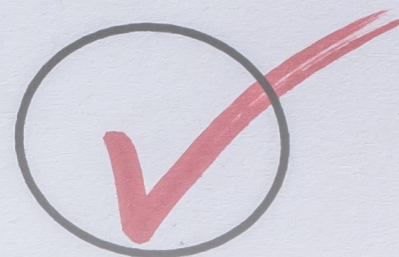
Every student and at least one parent of a dependent student will need an FSA ID. If a parent already has an FSA ID or has more than one child attending college, the parent will use the same FSA ID to sign all applications, but each child must have their own FSA ID.

It is highly recommended that a dependent student attend the appointment or event with a parent so both parts of the FAFSA can be submitted at that time.
