Critical Thinking Skills	Ability to use logic and reasoning to identify the strengths and weaknesses of alternative solutions, conclusions, or approaches to problems.	 Follow a process from start to finish, sequence information. Adapt decisions based on new information. Handle demanding and stressful situations. Ability to problem solve complex situations while maintaining a professional demeanor.
Mobility/Motor Skills	Possess physical strength, flexibility, and dexterity to safely perform chainsaw and climbing operations, as well as other industry standard operations outlined in ANSI Z 133.	Safe operation of a chainsaw.Tree climbing.
Tactile Skills	Ability to work with equipment, tools, supplies, plants, and trees in a variety of hands-on learning settings.	 Tie ropes. Operate a chainsaw.
Auditory Skills	Possess sufficient auditory ability to work effectively and safely.	Hear over sound of a chainsaw.
Visual Skills	Possess sufficient visual ability for observation and assessment necessary in the classroom, lab, and other locations on the campus.	Tree and plant identification.Disease identification.



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Communication Skills	Ability to communicate in class and in arborist settings.	 Communicate with ground crew while in a tree. Communicate over the sound of a chainsaw.
Interpersonal Skills	 Possess sufficient personal skills for interactions with customers, colleagues, supervisors, and others from a variety of social, emotional, cultural, and intellectual backgrounds. 	Exhibit positive interpersonal skills in all interactions.
Behavioral Skills	Ability to learn and apply workplace responsibilities.	Safe operation of a chainsaw.
